This innovative educational model allows parents to go to work knowing their children will be safe and secure and getting the most from their virtual school day.

But the Academy offers much more than tech support. Stream Childcare Academy's new Virtual Assistance Program allows students enrolled in online schooling to get in-person academic support, a safe environment to interact with other children, and allows their otherwise home-bound parents the freedom to go to work.

"If I wasn't here," says one student, "I would be at my dad's office. It's important for kids to be together when learning."

Educators and parents agree. Besides offering this new service, Stream Childcare Academy takes numerous measures to ensure the health and safety of students; playground equipment and toys are sanitized daily using a revolutionary, child-safe antiviral ULV fog, students are supervised while washing their hands, and face masks are required for visitors, staff, and older students.
